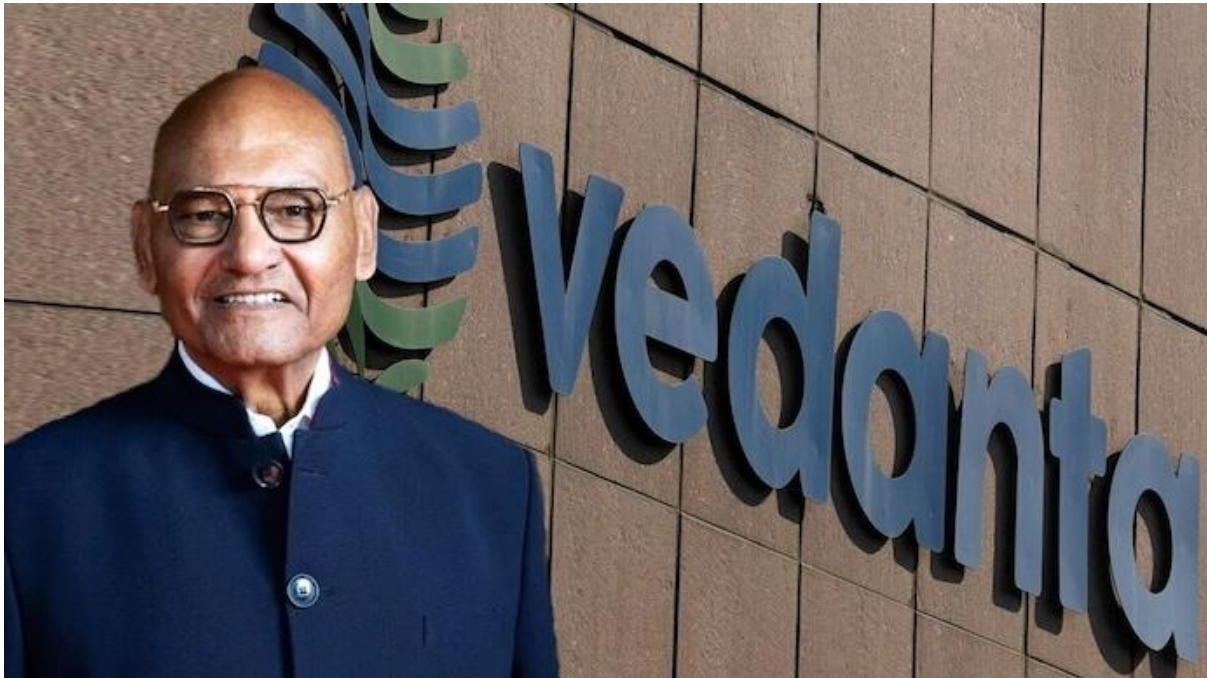


AI saves 75% of my time: Anil Agarwal on why Indians should not fear new tech
